RELATING TO DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE IN THE BOROUGH OF MILLVILLE

Sec. 1 Be it ordained by the Chief Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville and is hereby enacted by authority of the same, that from and after the publication of this ordinance it shall not be lawful for any dog to run at large within the limits of the Borough unless accompanied by and directly controlled by its owner and if any dog shall be found running at large and not be accompanied by and controlled as stated above, it shall be the duty of the High Constable of the Borough to immediately kill and properly bury such dog. For which service he shall receive One Dollar and fifty cents per head.

Sec. 2. And it is further ordained that in case of a mad dog, or dogs known to have been bitten or to have been fighting with a mad dog it shall be the duty of the aforesaid officers to notify the owners of said dogs when known, to immediately kill them and upon their refusal to do so the High Constable shall immediately kill and properly bury such dogs wherever found within the Borough for which service they shall receive One Dollar and fifty cents.
