

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDED FOR A TAX ON DOGS AND BITCHES IN THE  
BOROUGH OF MILLVILLE, COUNTY OF COLUMBIA AND THE STATE OF  
PENNSYLVANIA, AND FIXING THE AMOUNT OF SAID TAXES.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Chief Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville and is hereby enacted by authority of the same, That after the passage of this ordinance it shall be lawful for the Council of the Borough of Millville to levy and collect annually from the owners of Dogs, the sum of One Dollar for the First Dog harbored or kept by him or her, and the sum of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents for the second or each additional Dog so kept or harbored; the owner of each Bitch shall pay the sum of Two Dollars for the first Bitch, and the further sum of Five Dollars for each additional Bitch kept or harbored.

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Borough Council or other person making out the duplicate of the Borough taxes to make a duplicate of the Dog taxes assessed under this ordinance upon Dogs assessed in said Borough as returned to the County Commissioners, or known to be kept or harbored by any taxable of said Borough, which duplicate shall be delivered to the Collector of Taxes, who shall collect the said Dog Tax in the same manner that other taxes are collected.
